The case is exciting and mysterious because the murderer has not been identified to this day. At the time of death there were three people in the room, one of whom must have been the murderer or seen the murder.

While I was watching the video, I thought to myself how bad it actually is to be killed because of your origins. Never being able to live again. Never being able to see his family again. Can no longer say goodbye. and the fact that it happens so often is just sad.

After the video we were asked what we thought and what we saw and felt about the video.
